SQL for CRIS

An introduction to commonly used commands and approaches to querying the SQL CRIS database. Attendees will learn more about the SQL CRIS database and have a chance to practice querying the data including:

- Single table, simple queries
- Single table, complex queries
 - Multiple table, joins

Attendees must have some prior basic knowledge of using SQL.
